# Community Partner Membership

## Eligibility

Community Partner Members include any organization or business that supports the mission, vision, and values of the Coalition and <u>does not</u> provide domestic violence services.

Examples of Community Partners include, but are not limited to:

- legal services
- health services
- religious communities
- batterer intervention programs
- businesses
- culturally-specific organizations that are not domestic violence agencies or campuses





#### Fee

#### Membership Term
